Use this map to guide yourself around the property. While exploring indoors and outdoors, please be aware of your surroundings and maintain at least 6 feet (2 meters) between yourself and other parties. We ask that you wash or sanitize your hands frequently and that all visitors wear face coverings indoors, even if vaccinated, for the safety of everyone. All buildings are open with restrictions in place, except the American Art & Carousel Gallery, which is currently closed due to construction expanding The Hundred Acre School. The carousel will open to the public once construction is complete.

Top Ten “Must See” Spots at Heritage!

1. **The J.K. Lilly III Automobile Gallery:** Explore a superb collection of antique cars and learn the origin story of the American automobile in this year’s exhibit *From Carriage to Classic: How Automobiles Transformed America*.
2. **The McGraw Family Garden of the Senses:** Engage all your senses in this colorful, accessible, and calming garden space. Explore further to discover the history of our 200+ year old windmill.
3. **The Flume Field:** Experience a dramatic 18 ft waterfall and the surrounding collection of daylilies.
4. **The Hydrangea Gardens:** These two gardens include the Cape Cod Hydrangea Society Display Garden featuring historic hydrangeas and the North American Hydrangea Test Garden showcasing new hybrid varieties.
5. **The Labyrinth:** Relax, meditate, and commune with nature under the trees.
6. **The Special Exhibitions Gallery:** A playful experience awaits you in this year’s changing exhibit *Let’s Play: New England Toy Stories*, where you will discover the local roots of many of America’s most beloved toys and games.
7. **Wetu:** Experience a traditional full-sized Wampanoag dwelling structure and learn historical and contemporary information about the Mashpee tribe.
8. **Hidden Hollow:** Currently open with limited hands-on materials, visitors can splash, move, climb, create, explore, follow a storybook trail, and more in this outdoor discovery area.
9. **Nature trails:** Rich with wildlife and the melodies of songbirds, Heritage boasts several miles of nature trails that wind through the grounds.
10. **The McInnes Garden:** This magical round garden features pollinator-attracting plants this year. Here you’ll find host plants for many native butterflies of Cape Cod and plantings for native bees.
