Time	Activity	Location	Purpose
8:30-9:00	Rolling Drop-Off	School Vestibule	Allow time for varied drop-offs, screening questions, and admittance.
9:00	Start of School Day	Classrooms	
8:30-9:05	Curiosity & Wonder	Classrooms	Allow time for varied student arrivals and free choice in classroom.
9:05-9:15	Morning Meeting	Classroom	Group welcome and orientation to daily activities
9:15-9:35	Snack	Classroom	Time for informal conversations with teachers and children
9:35-9:45	Hypothesis Time	Classroom	Build background knowledge, ask questions and share ideas related to the question or topic of the day.
9:45 - 10:15	Investigation Explorations	Classroom	Station Time: Engage children in opportunities that support their curiosity through free choice activities.
10:15-10:30	Transition to Outside	Bathrooms & Classroom	Designated whole class restroom time & organization to go on an adventure
10:30 -12:00	Investigation Adventures	Outside on grounds of the museum	Engage children in opportunities extend their learning outdoors
12:00-12:30	Lunch	Classroom	Time for informal conversations
12:30-1:00	Recess	Playground	Free Play
1:00-2:00	Dream Time	Classrooms	Opportunities for listening to relaxing music, quiet activities or rest (if needed)
2:00-2:45	Investigation Extensions	Classroom or Outside	Extend and revisit daily experience in the classroom or outdoors
2:45-2:55	Transition to Outside	Bathrooms & Classroom	Designated as a tiem for packing up, restrooms and any other closing needs
3:00	End of School Day		
2:50-3:20	Rolling Pick Up	Playground or Classroom depending on the weather	Free play to allow time for varied pick-up times and parking lot turnover
3:10-3:30	Transition to After Care & Snack	Classroom	Time to have an afternoon snack and informal conversations with teachers and children
3:30-4:30	After Care Free Play	Playground or Classroom depending on the weather	Extended day allow time for varied pick-up times with free play options.

(Daily schedules will vary depending on the needs of the children, families, and the classroom lesson plans)
